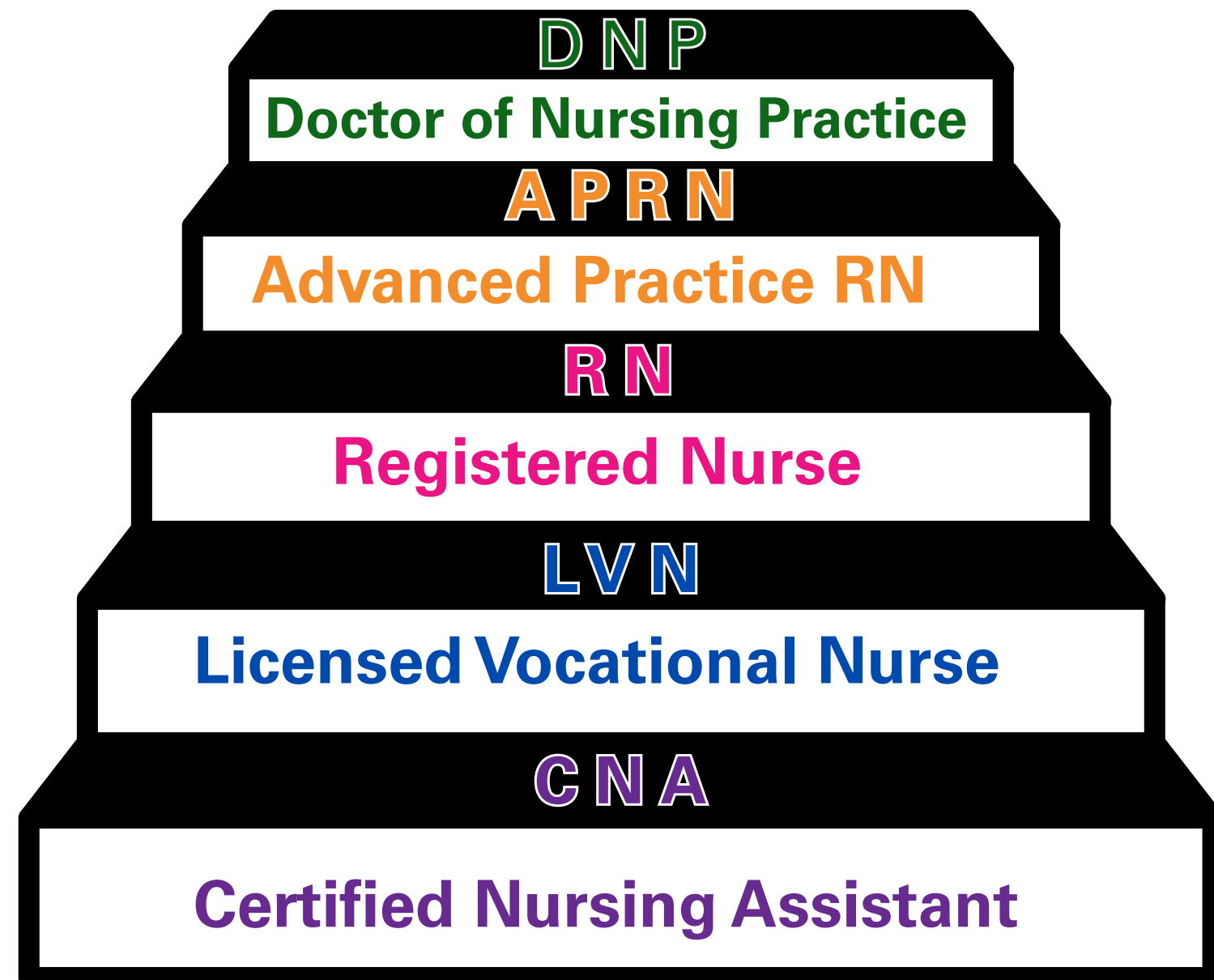

Why GCC Nursing?



The Registered Nursing (RN) Program at Glendale Community College (GCC) is approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN)



Effective September 2023, the Registered Nursing (RN) Program at Glendale Community College (GCC) obtained accreditation by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN)

Transfer level Math

3 units

- No more than one (1) substandard grade (W, C-, D, F) between these three courses within the last 7 years
- These courses must include labs that were completed in person
- COVID-19 Conditions:
 - Substandard grades (W, EW, NP, C-, D, F) in Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology taken during Spring 2020, Summer 2020, and Fall 2020 will not be counted towards GPA calculations and will not count as a repeat
 - Online/Hybrid lab courses will be accepted from Spring 2020 - Fall 2022
- A "P" notation will be interpreted as a "C" in the Chancellor's Formula
- Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, and Microbiology must total 14 semester units. In the event that there are insufficient units, only a college Chemistry course (with lab) will be used to make up the deficit.
- AP scores of 3 or higher will be accepted for Psychology, English, and Math. The department must receive your CollegeBoard transcript to verify this.
- Lifespan and/or Developmental Psychology are not accepted and cannot be substituted for General Psychology
- Transfer level Math can include any of the following courses:
 - ECON 127 or MATH 100, 103E/H, 104E/H, 105/H, 107/H, 108/H, 110/A/B, 111, 112/+, 133, 134, 135, 136, 136/+/H

EQUIVALENCY

- All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.
- Grades of "C-" will not be considered.
- Cumulative GPA (from all schools attended) must be at least 2.50
- Science GPA (Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology) must be at least 2.00
- No more than one (1) substandard grade (W, C-, D, F) between the science prerequisites (Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology) within the last 7 years. COVID-19 Conditions: Substandard grades (W, C-, D, F) in Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology taken during Spring 2020, Summer 2020, and Fall 2020 will not be counted towards GPA calculations or repeats.
- All prerequisite courses taken outside GCC must be equivalent (may require review of syllabus)

CHANCELLOR'S FORMULA CUT SCORE

The following are considered in the Chancellor's Formula

- Cumulative GPA
- Science GPA (Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology)
- Freshman English
- Science Repeats (No more than one (1) substandard grade (W, C-, D, F) between the science prerequisites (Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology) within the last 7 years)

If your Chancellor's Formula score is 75% or higher, applicants continue for review of Eligibility Criteria #3

If your Chancellor's Formula score is lower than 75%, you will be offered the option to complete the Chancellor's Formula (CF) Remediation Plan. You are not eligible to move forward to Eligibility Criteria #3 until you have completed the CF Remediation Plan

TEST OF ESSENTIAL ACADEMIC SKILLS (TEAS)

The Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) is required for all eligible applicants. Applicants must receive a total score of 62% or higher on their first attempt of the current version to be eligible

- If you have taken the TEAS 7, send your score electronically via www.atitesting.com to GLENDALE CC ADN CA
- If you have not taken the TEAS 7, you will be invited via email to take the TEAS at the nursing department on select dates

If the first attempt of your TEAS 7 total score is 62% or higher, you will be eligible for random selection

If the first attempt of your TEAS 7 is lower than 62%, you will be offered the TEAS Remediation plan. Other TEAS attempts cannot be considered for random selection until you have completed the TEAS Remediation

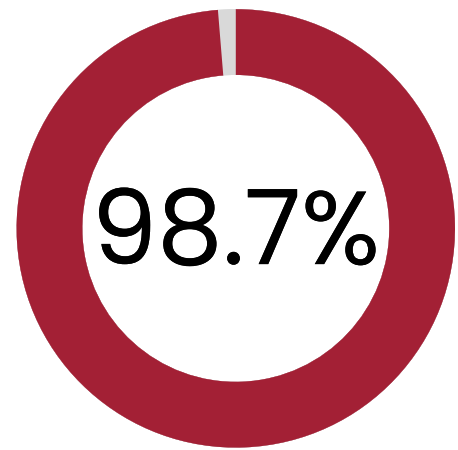


Students cannot select their own clinical rotations as clinical placements are arranged by the Nursing Department.
